- Bordered bySouth AfricaMozambique.



# **INTRODUCTION** (Cont.)

The national forest inventory of 1999 at Eswatini indicated a 45% coverage of forests and woodlands:

- □ Natural forests 2.2%,
- Natural Woodlands 22.0%,
- Natural Bushlands 13.4%,
- □ Wattle forests 1.4%
- □ Plantation forests 6.4%.
- ► A new national forest inventory is overdue.

## **OBJECTIVES**

- ► To acquire a reliable data to form the basis for the long term guide for decision making, planning and monitoring of forest resources and activities.
- ► To Minimize the destructive Impact of uncontrolled fires on lives, property, resources and environment.
- To enable appropriate management and use of fire to enhance land use and promote sustainable livelihoods.
- ► To maintain and enhance ecosystem function and sustainability through appropriate fire regimes.

#### PRESENT STATUS

- The country does not have an updated data on forest inventory.
- Lack of financial resources to undertake forest inventory
- The country experiences a widespread of forest fires countrywide.
- ► The local communities lack the knowledge and skills to fight the Fires.
- ► The fire fighting task has not been fully decentralized to rural communities.

#### **FUTURE PLANS**

- To involve stakeholders in collecting forestry resources data and information annually.
- ► To conduct forestry resources assessment in the whole country.
- Continuous monitoring of the forest resources with the assistance of JAXA.
- Harmonize Institutional Fire Management Framework.
- Increase stakeholder awareness and participation of public and private institutions on Fire Management Issues.
- By reducing wildfires in the country could improve the economy since Forestry, Agriculture and Pasture are greatly affected whereas they are the main drivers of the Economy.

#### **STRATEGIES**

- Forestry Department will collaborate with Forest Industry Companies in data collection for both natural forests and plantations.
- Conduct stakeholder workshops on data collection, processing, compilation and information dissemination.

## **STRATEGIES (Cont.)**

- Select focal areas in communities including those next to Forest Plantations and Cattle Fattening Ranches and urban areas.
- Mobilize traditional leaders to organize community meetings and trainings for selected volunteer fire brigades from each community.
- Encourage communities to have their own Firebreaks.
- Have fire management programmes for each community as they have their own unique land uses.
- Have Fire Brigades leading fire management programmes in their area.
- Finalize the MoU between Eswatini and South Africa that is aimed at dealing with trans boundary fire issues.
